7 Things to Remember During the Lord's Supper

1. One Lord – “There is one Lord” Eph. 4:5
2. Two thieves – “There were also two others, criminals, led with Him to be put to death.” Lk. 23:42
3. Three crosses – Lk. 23:39-43
4. Four parts of His garments – “Then the soldiers, when they had crucified Jesus, took His garments and made four parts, to each soldier, a part, and also the tunic.” Jn. 19:32
5. Five wounds – His back was scourged, head was crowned with thorns, hands and feet were pierced and side was cut opened. Jn. 19:1-2, 34; Psalm 22:16
6. Six hours of agony – He was crucified on the 3rd hour and died in the 9th hour Mk. 15:25-37
7. Seven statements spoke by Christ – Matt. 27:46; Lk. 23:34, 43-46; Jn. 19:26-30

What Must I do to be Saved?

Learn the Truth (hear) - Jn. 8:32, 17:17; Rom 10:17

Believe in Christ – Jn. 8:24, 20:31; Heb 11:6

Repent of all sins – Lk. 13:3; Acts 17:30; Rom 2:4

Confession of Faith – Acts 17:30; Rom 10:10

Baptism – Act 2:38, 22:16

Live Faithfully – Rev 2:10

In Luke chapter 15 we read of a man having 100 sheep and he loses one. We next read of a woman having ten pieces of silver and she loses one. Finally, we see a man who had two sons and he lost one. The sheep can represent lost property, the coin can represent lost finance, and the son can represent lost souls.

The man having 100 sheep losing one means he lost 1%. The woman having ten pieces of silver and losing one means she lost 10%. The man having two sons and losing one means he lost 50%.

The man who lost one sheep searched until he found it. The woman who lost one piece of silver swept and searched until she found it. However, the man who lost one son did not even lift a finger to find him.

From these parables we learn many lessons about rejoicing when the lost are found. However, we also learn a deeper lesson if we are willing to make the proper application.

We learn that people will do all they can to regain their property. We will fight to the last amount of our strength to regain our finances. Yet, most of us will do nothing to gain a lost soul. HOW SAD!

Christians moving from one congregation to another does NOT constitute church growth. There is no growth until a believer obeys the Gospel plan of salvation. The church grows when believers repent and are baptized into Christ (Acts 2:38; Romans 6:3-4). God adds those who are being saved to the church of Christ (Mark 16:16; Acts 2:47).

If the church in our community is not growing, it could be because we are not confronting people with the Gospel of Christ. We make the excuse that no one will listen, but how do we know? Have we really tried?

We have no problem talking about our homes, jobs, sports, or material things, but we can offer only excuses about why we are not spreading the Gospel. We simply must learn to talk about spiritual things and to lovingly confront the lost about where their souls will spend eternity (2 Thessalonians 1:6-10).

It is easy to dream about serving the Lord, but giving ourselves wholeheartedly to Christ takes real effort on our part. The eternal destination of so many souls depend on our willingness to put forth that effort.

Let us pray that the Lord will fill our hearts with love for the lost, so much so that we will be willing to make whatever sacrifices are necessary to take the Gospel to this lost and dying world.

Jesus Christ, the greatest role model, commanded His disciples to spread the Gospel to every creature throughout all nations (Mark 16:15; Luke 24:46-47).

He said, "19 Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: 20 teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen" (Matthew 28:19-20).

The world begins right outside our door. We have the tools to help us (Internet, tracts, books, business cards, and other Bible teaching material). May each of us resolve to do our part in winning souls for Jesus! The God of Heaven and Earth is so good. We love you all with the Love of the Lord (John 13:34-35).
