7 Things to Remember During the Lord's Supper

1. One Lord – “There is one Lord” Eph. 4:5
2. Two thieves – “There were also two others, criminals, led with Him to be put to death.” Lk. 23:42
3. Three crosses – Lk. 23:39-43
4. Four parts of His garments – “Then the soldiers, when they had crucified Jesus, took His garments and made four parts, to each soldier, a part, and also the tunic.” Jn. 19:32
5. Five wounds – His back was scourged, head was crowned with thorns, hands and feet were pierced and side was cut opened. Jn. 19:1-2, 34; Psalm 22:16
6. Six hours of agony – He was crucified on the 3rd hour and died in the 9th hour Mk. 15:25-37
7. Seven statements spoke by Christ – Matt. 27:46; Lk. 23:34, 43-46; Jn. 19:26-30

Jesus said, “But I say to you that for every idle word men may speak, they will give account of it in the day of judgment” (Matthew 12:36).

We find in the Scriptures where the word gossip is used in conjunction with maliciousness. Thus, the scriptural term used is “malicious gossip.”

2 Timothy 2:1-5, “But realize this, that in the last days difficult times will come. For men will be lovers of self, lovers of money, boastful, arrogant, revilers, disobedient to parents, ungrateful, unholy, unloving, irreconcilable, malicious gossips, without self-control, brutal, haters of good, treacherous, reckless, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, holding to a form of godliness, although they have denied its power; Avoid such men as these.” Men, as well as women!

What Must I do to be Saved?

Learn the Truth (hear) - Jn. 8:32, 17:17; Rom 10:17

Believe in Christ – Jn. 8:24, 20:31; Heb 11:6

Repent of all sins – Lk. 13:3; Acts 17:30; Rom 2:4

Confession of Faith – Acts 17:30; Rom 10:10

Baptism – Act 2:38, 22:16

Live Faithfully – Rev 2:10

Does this describe you in your life? By definition, one prone to slander, a slanderous person, falsely accusing others by their words and thereby becomes the one who does the devil's bidding?

1 Timothy 3:11, "Women must likewise be dignified, not malicious gossips, but temperate, faithful in all things." Christians have received direct commandments from God Almighty concerning this practice.

James 3:6-8, "And the tongue is a fire, a world of iniquity. The tongue is so set among our members that it defiles the whole body, and sets on fire the course of nature; and it is set on fire by hell."

Let the reader understand that "no man can tame the tongue" doesn't mean one cannot control their tongue, but rather they should never feel comfortable turning their back on it, like a wild animal.

Every idle word carries with it the definition of "slanderous, accusing falsely" (diábolos, dee-ab'-ol-os), the devil an accuser of men, siding with the devil (Thayer).

Malicious gossip usually starts like this, "Well, did you hear what I heard about them?" Then, it proceeds with one making unfounded accusations that are straight from the devil's bag of lies. Finally, it ends in slander when the one listening repeats these words. Who hasn't been the victim of malicious gossip?
