6. Six hours of agony – He was crucified on the 3rd hour and died in the 9th hour Mk. 15:25-37
7. Seven statements spoke by Christ – Matt. 27:46; Lk. 23:34, 43-46; Jn. 19:26-30

Let's examine some changes that have come about over the past 60 years that certainly make the 1950's look very inviting.

wife! When it is pointed out that in the beginning God made them male and female (Matthew 19:4), someone is bound to reply, "This is not the 1950's."

[It is strange that two men would behave in a relationship imitating traditional marriage roles because in marriages between men and women they have drifted from the Biblical roles!]

2) Career wives and mothers. Wives are a blessing to their husbands. God created Eve (a wife) to suit the needs of Adam (1 Corinthians 11:9), and men and women need one another (1 Corinthians 11:11-12). But someone once said, "When you put career in front of wife, you've lost a lot of the wife." I understand that single women must support themselves. I understand married women may have a sick husband and must provide the income, but poor planning and preparation, laziness on the part of the husband, and pure old materialism is the problem more times than not! (1 John 2:15-17). The apostles of Jesus command that wives/mothers love their husbands and children, and to "guide the house" and serve in the role of "homemakers" (see 1 Timothy 2:15; 5:14; Titus 2:5). Today, roles are shifting so quickly that almost overnight it has become difficult to tell who the mother is in a young family. We need to get back to raising little girls to play with dolls and to play house, rather than emphasizing being a sports hero or the next President! When someone says, "It is supposed to be a joy for a young wife to look forward to bringing up children," (Psalm 113:9), someone is bound to say, "It is not in the 1950's"!

3) Refusing to correct children. Children are a blessing from heaven, but children are trained and brought up on earth. The failure to correct children is pointed out on several occasions in the scriptures. Eli failed to restrain his sons Hophni and Phinehas (1 Samuel 3:13). Passive parenting is not parenting! David, a man after God's own heart, failed as a father regarding Adonijah. The Bible says that David never displeased him, or, in other words, he never reprimanded him (1 Kings 1:6). In both cases above, the sons died young. When someone says that "Fathers are to train their children in the discipline and instruction of the Lord," and to "spare not the rod," (Ephesians 6:4; Proverbs 13:24), someone is bound to be heard saying, "This is not the 1950's."

4) Preaching losing its backbone. There was a time when powerful sermons reproved, rebuked and exhorted members to come out of worldliness and serve Christ wholeheartedly. The preaching of old is no longer in demand in much of the United States. Any man preaching today using too much serious urgency and emotion in his appear may quickly be accused of being angry and unloving. The soft, tiptoe around the subject approach has grown popular in too many places. Don't think for a moment that the old-fashioned type preachers are not marked and no longer recommended in many congregations. You see, there is the fear of offending people. I guess John the baptizer and Jesus would be called unloving by today's popular standard! (see Matthew 3:7-10 and Matthew 23:13-36). I was told recently that, "Preachers must communicate with millennials differently than we have done traditionally with middle-aged and older adults." Really? Friend, the same gospel that saved the first hearers of the gospel is the only gospel that will save sinners, including today's sinner. Preachers aren't preaching faithfully if they refuse to, or are not allowed to, "...reprove, rebuke, exhort with all long suffering and doctrine" (2 Timothy 4:2). Many of the problems stated above are being seen in churches because gospel preaching has lost its backbone! When someone says, "The gospel is the power of God unto salvation, and we must stand in the way and ask for the old paths," (Romans 1:16; Jeremiah 6:16), someone is bound to say, "It's not the 1950's."

Maybe what people are really saying when they say, "It's not the 1950's" is, "It is not the Bible times." The word of God is timeless (Psalms 119:89; Hebrews 13:8; Rev. 22:18, 19). The New Testament of Christ was never given an expiration date. I am sure some of the things I have pointed out in this article are not popular with some of my readers. Let me ask you this: Have I shared the truth? Are you ashamed of some of the doctrines and teachings of the Bible?

Jesus warns us: "For whosoever shall be ashamed of me and of my words, of him shall the Son of man be ashamed, when he shall come in his own glory, and in his Father's, and of the holy angels" (Luke 9:26). Study about these things in your Bible.
