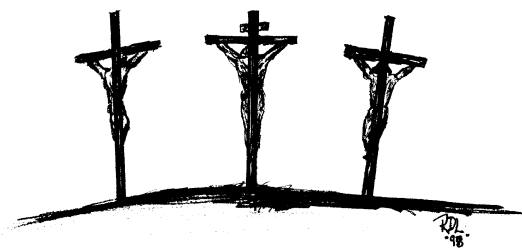

7 Things to Remember During the Lord's Supper

1. One Lord – “There is one Lord” Eph. 4:5
2. Two thieves – “There were also two others, criminals, led with Him to be put to death.” Lk. 23:42
3. Three crosses – Lk. 23:39-43
4. Four parts of His garments – “Then the soldiers, when they had crucified Jesus, took His garments and made four parts, to each soldier, a part, and also the tunic.” Jn. 19:32
5. Five wounds – His back was scourged, head was crowned with thorns, hands and feet were pierced and side was cut opened. Jn. 19:1-2, 34; Psalm 22:16
6. Six hours of agony – He was crucified on the 3rd hour and died in the 9th hour Mk. 15:25-37
7. Seven statements spoke by Christ – Matt. 27:46; Lk. 23:34, 43-46; Jn. 19:26-30

STAY THE COURSE

"Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God." Hebrews 12:1-2

"Looking unto Jesus" - My understanding of this expression is that it had to do with the runners in a race. They would look forward to some goal ahead of them as they raced to not be distracted by the crowd or the runners next to them. This figure is very helpful for us as Christians. The idea is to remain focused on Christ so we will not be distracted by the things of this world or other people. When we fail to keep our eyes on Christ, is when we begin to sink in the storm of this life. Peter experienced this on the Sea of Galilee. He was doing fine walking on the water till he was distracted by the waves and took his eyes off Jesus. There are so many folks I have witnessed in my life whose lives were an absolute mess. They ran from one thing to another without any sense of stability. They bounced from one relationship to another. They were unstable financially and not dependable. They are fickle in such a way that one could not depend on them. I call them "flighty." That is a term I use to describe how God viewed the people of Israel when He called them a "silly dove." They had nothing in their lives to anchor them and keep them on course. It was because the people of Israel were looking to receive help from every place but God.

"Ephraim also is like a silly dove without heart: they call to Egypt, they go to Assyria." (Hosea 7:11)

Paul warned the church of Ephesus of this condition. Yes, we see the "silly dove" today who runs from one religious fad to another because they are focused on the wrong things. There are many religious folks who are fickle, unstable, not trustworthy - "flighty."

"That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive;" (Ephesians 4:14)

It is easy to get distracted in this world. It is easy to take our eyes off Jesus and look at others around us to see what they are doing. My friend don't go through life an utter and confused mess. Are you not tired of running from one trend to another? Do you find yourself unsatisfied no matter how hard you try? Could it be you are not running a straight and efficient race in your life because you have not focused your attention on Jesus? Set your eyes on Christ and "stay the course."
